We all wear masks and we do it for a number of reasons.

Thomas <u>inherited his mother's 2 million dollar Brownstone</u> in New York. Only problem is it wasn't paid for and Thomas <u>couldn't make the payments</u>.

He began dressing like this, forged his mother's social security checks, and <u>cashed in close to</u> \$100,000.00

He was finally caught because they said he didn't sound or walk like an 80 year old woman.

We all wear masks, now maybe not for the same reason Tomas Harkin wore a mask, but we all wear them.

WHY? Because we have some secret we want to hide from the people around us.

We all have...

Skeletons in the closet

Things we're not proud of...

Habits that harm us...

We HIDE because the pressure to be NORMAL is HUGE.

Have you ever noticed that NORMAL is on a fluctuating scale?

Don't be Normal, be who God called you to be.

Genesis 3 – Story of the first Masks that were worn by people in the Bible...

God created mankind, Adam and Eve we are told and **He created them and US will this thing** called Free Will.

He <u>placed them in this Beautiful garden</u> with all these trees that bore fruit and he said to them. Now, there are lots of trees here, you can eat from any of them except this one. The one here right in the middle of the garden.

#1. Did God really say that?

#2. Did God really mean what He said?

² "Of course we may eat fruit from the trees in the garden," the woman replied. ³ "It's only the fruit from the tree in the middle of the garden that we are not allowed to eat. God said, 'You must not eat it or even touch it; if you do, you will die."

⁴ "You won't die!" the serpent replied to the woman. ⁵ "God knows that your eyes will be opened as soon as you eat it, and you will be like God, knowing both good and evil."

Did God really mean that sex outside of the covenant of marriage makes 2 people become 1?

Did God really mean that too much alcohol consumption makes us a fool?

Did God really mean what He said?

#3. It won't hurt just to look at it.

⁶ The woman was convinced. **She saw** that the tree was beautiful and its fruit looked delicious, and she wanted the wisdom it would give her. So she took some of the fruit and ate it. Then she gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it, too.

She looked at it...

It looked good...

She wanted it...

She took it...

She gave it to others...

It all starts in the Eye. Guard your eyes. Guard your heart. Don't expose yourself to things that God said to stay away from!

#4. Then comes the shame and the masks.

⁷ At that moment their eyes were opened, and they suddenly felt shame at their nakedness. So they **sewed fig leaves together to cover themselves**.

⁸ When the cool evening breezes were blowing, the man and his wife heard the LORD God walking about in the garden. So they hid from the LORD God among the trees. ⁹ Then the LORD God called to the man, "Where are you?"

¹⁰ He replied, "I heard you walking in the garden, so I hid. I was afraid because I was naked."

The Fig Leaves, they were the first masks mankind ever wore.

Our natural reaction, when we have done something we shouldn't have done is to HIDE, to put on a MASK.

#5. Then we have to decide how to deal with the shame

¹¹ "Who told you that you were naked?" the LORD God asked. "Have you eaten from the tree whose fruit I commanded you not to eat?"

¹² The man replied, "It was the woman you gave me who gave me the fruit, and I ate it."

¹³ Then the LORD God asked the woman, "What have you done?"

"The serpent deceived me," she replied. "That's why I ate it."

We have looked.

We liked what we saw.

We took it.

We now feel the shame.

Adam said, "God, it's your fault! God, it was that woman You gave to me... it is her fault

How are you dealing with your shame?
